Limited headroom required the design and manufacture of specialist lifting equipment to allow components weighing up to 900kg to be safely removed and replaced in the roofspace. The intricate process of lifting heavy components over the arena's timber velodrome added further complexity. Ensuring that the roof was operational, tested, and ready ahead of the 2025 Australian Open was a non-negotiable requirement.
